#### \*Communion

1st Corinthians 11:26-29 tells us... "For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes. So then, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord. Everyone ought to examine themselves before they eat of the bread and drink from the cup. For those who eat and drink without discerning the body of Christ eat and drink judgment on themselves"

L: As we enter into this time of Communion, a time of remembering Christ as the Son of God, the sacrificial lamb, the very one who would take away the sins of the world, let us reflect on what He has done for us. For, if we say we have no sin we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us.

Let us now confess our sin to God who is faithful and just and through the redemption found in Christ, has promised to forgive our sin and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

# Silence for Reflection

L: Most merciful God,

C: have mercy on us. We confess to you that we have sinned against you in thought, word and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not trusted you with our whole heart; we have not loved one another in deed and in truth. In your compassion forgive our sin and so uphold us by your Spirit that we may live and serve you in newness of life through Jesus Christ our light and our truth. Amen.

L: With joy, we have the assurance that as a redeemed child of Almighty God, rich in mercy, abundant in love, forgives us of all our sin and grants us newness of life in Jesus Christ.

C: Thanks be to God!

### **Communion prayer:**

P: Let us pray, Blessed are you,

C: O Lord our God, maker of all things. Through your goodness the table is now set that were consecrated by Bishop Paula for us today. As we come to your table, we offer ourselves to your service and dedicate our lives to the care and redemption of all that you have made, for the sake of Him who gave Himself for us, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

\* When our brothers and sisters gathered in worship with Bishop Paula Schmidt, they heard again the story of God's mighty acts and of the love shown to us in Jesus' life, death, resurrection, and ascension, and we shared in the holy meal of the Lord's Supper. Now, this same word of life, and this same bread and cup of blessing is brought to us yet again, so that we may share in these gifts and be strengthened in communion with all the people of God.

This is the supper of our Lord Jesus Christ, and this meal is shared with the assurance of our Lord's presence through the gift of the Holy Spirit. This bread and cup, shared in the gathering of our faith, are given for you.

Now gathered at the Lord's Table, we celebrate with thanksgiving that "in the night in which Jesus was betrayed, He took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples saying: Take and eat; this is my body given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper He took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink saying: "This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me."
